

Registration Policy

RRTI requires a purchase order and/or voucher number to register by fax. Registrations received without payment do not guarantee enrollment in the seminar. The fees listed include the cost of program materials. They do not include any meal costs or overnight accommodations. All registrations received less than 5 days prior to the seminar date will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis, space permitting. All registrants will receive written confirmation of their registration. Registrants wishing to cancel must inform RRTI at least 14 (fourteen) working days prior to the seminar date to avoid liability for the entire fee. A \$15.00 processing fee will be held for each cancelled registrant. In cases where cancellations are not received 14 days prior to the seminar, refunds will not be made. *No – Shows will be invoiced for the entire fee.* Substitutions can be made at any time.

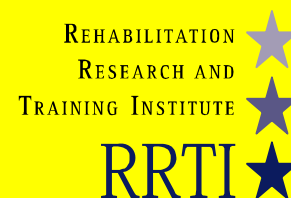
